Monica has acted in landmark cases before the International Court of Justice, the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea, the UN Human Rights Committee, and the European Court of Human Rights, including the first global climate - human rights case and the world's first Rights of Nature case before the Constitutional Court of Ecuador.

We are delighted to welcome her to speak on Rights of Nature as a Framework for Corporate Responsibility and Climate Litigation, focussing on international advisory trends, ESG implications, and responsibilities of both corporates and governments.

Drawing on her global litigation and advisory experience, Monica will explore the fast-developing legal landscape around the Rights of Nature movement, including the recognition of rivers and ecosystems as rights-bearing entities, implications for environmental governance, and the growing intersection between nature-based rights, climate litigation and corporate ESG responsibilities.
